### Concordia University Pharmacy Students Need Your Help!

Do you want to help develop the patient care skills and personal touch of the next generation to pharmacists? If the answer is yes, serving as a patient for pharmacy students at Concordia's School of Pharmacy is for you! Concordia School of Pharmacy (CUWSOP) works hard to build pharmacy students' patient care, communication, and interpersonal skills. For this volunteer opportunity, you will discuss a pre-determined problem that you occasionally experience that may be treated by an over-the-counter (OTC) product with pharmacy students and faculty. This may be something that you have experience with or would like to learn more about. Examples include management of cold or cough symptoms, dry eyes, or occasional pain. Pairs of pharmacy students will ask you questions to learn more about your problem. The students will then work with each other and course faculty will then discuss their recommendations for you. Course faculty will work with you prior to this activity to ensure that you feel prepared and answer any educational questions that you may have. This experience is designed to simulate an encounter that you would have with a pharmacist in your community. While students will be directly supervised by course faculty (who are licensed pharmacists), this opportunity should not replace visiting your doctor. All health information will be confidential. **Please use the sign up sheet in the Senior Center office to sign up before January 10 if possible, with a time that works in your schedule.** You will spend two hours interacting with the students in the classroom. There are multiple breaks and refreshments are provided. Lunch will also be provided with time to socialize and tour the pharmacy building.
